Thank you for your ongoing support as we finish the term together.

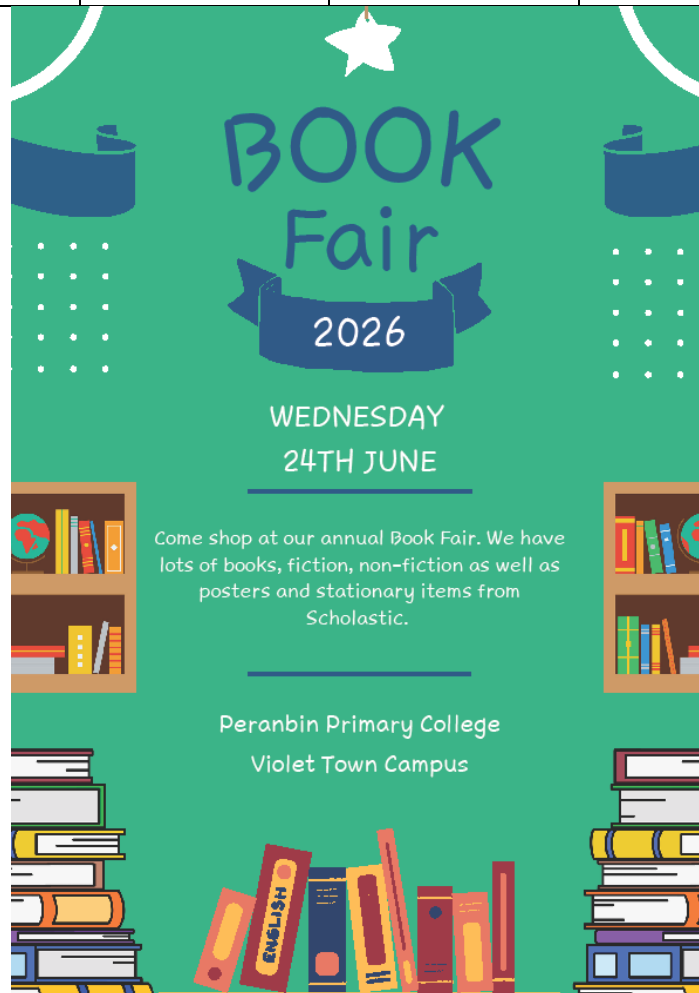

I was recently directed to the anglicarevic.org.au site and I was surprised to see that they offered so many services. Targeted support around families and parenting, children and young people, education, and family violence assistance. Help with food and paying of bills is also available.

Any of our families who are based in the Benalla Rural City Council may have already heard of the Tommorow Today Foundation. They offer all sorts of assistance, including a 'Fresh Food Trolley' at their Cecily Court address, free PEEP (Parent Early Education Partnership) sessions every week, and financial assistance for anyone wanting their child to participate in local sport. For further information regarding their services, give them a call on 5762 1211.

And of course, if family dynamics are becoming overwhelming and you need some guidance, the raisingchildren.net.au and triplep-parenting.net.au sites have all sorts of information available to support you.

Finally, our wonderful Peranbin Primary College team is here to help too. We have Foodbank hampers available to all, a second-hand uniform shop (a gold coin donation for each piece of clothing!) and our welcoming and supporting staff are always here if you need a chat, some advice and maybe some further guidance.

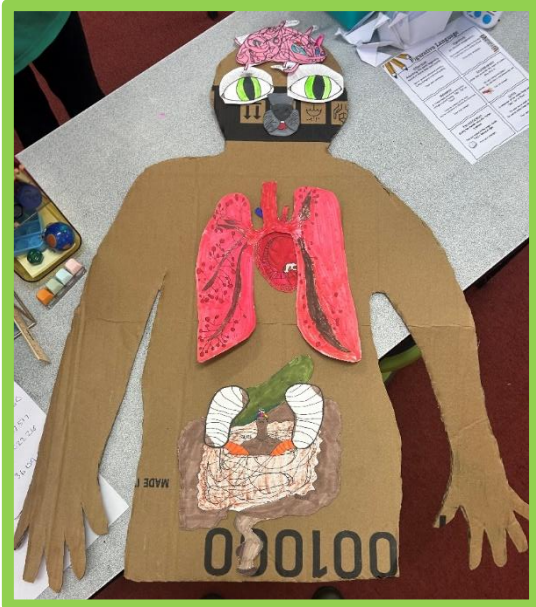

Violet Town News....

This week has been very busy finalising work for our upcoming Student Showcase, testing and assessments for report writing, and finishing off projects before the end of the term.

For Literacy, our Junior sound focus is “oo” as in book and spelling “oo” as in school. The Senior sound focus is “u” as in countryside or wonder.

Our Senior students participated in the annual State Library Book Bash writing sessions. The authors Aime Kaufman, Jess McGeachin, and Huda Hayek guided students through planning, creating settings and character development. Some of their amazing work will be displayed at the end of term Student Showcase.

During Maths we have been collecting data and showing the results in graphs. The lolly graphs were a student favourite. The Junior Class also graphed their favourite ice-cream flavours, while Senior students enjoyed an interactive maths strategy game.

This week our Health sessions with Ms Jung have concentrated on how much sugar is in our everyday foods. The kids were amazed to find out that there are 39 grams (almost 10 teaspoons) of sugar in a regular can of Coke, Fanta had 44 grams and a 600ml Banana Big M has a whopping 49 grams.

Friday, we finished the week with delicious hamburgers for a special lunch order day.

Environmental Science at Violet Town

This week all students visited the Violet Town kinder and completed a nature scavenger hunt. On the way back to school the Senior students showed the Junior students the various plantings in the Community Garden. We also recognised some capeweed, marshmallow, and milk thistle weeds on our journey. Students worked together to weed the garden beds and turn over the compost in our school garden in the afternoon and found worms in both places.

Thank you to the Gunaratne family for donating a blueberry bush to our garden-we hope to harvest some berries toward the end of the year.

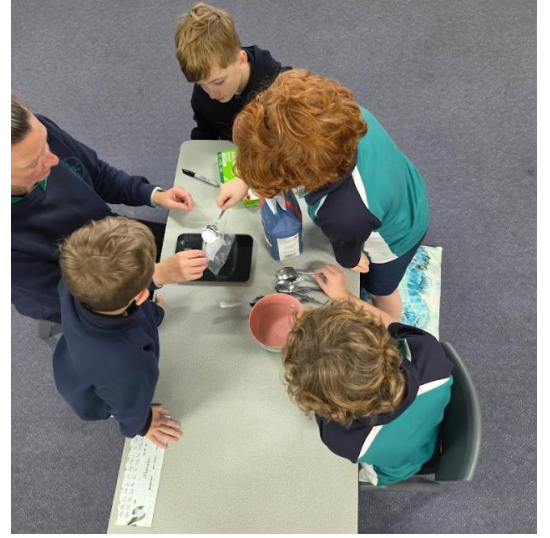

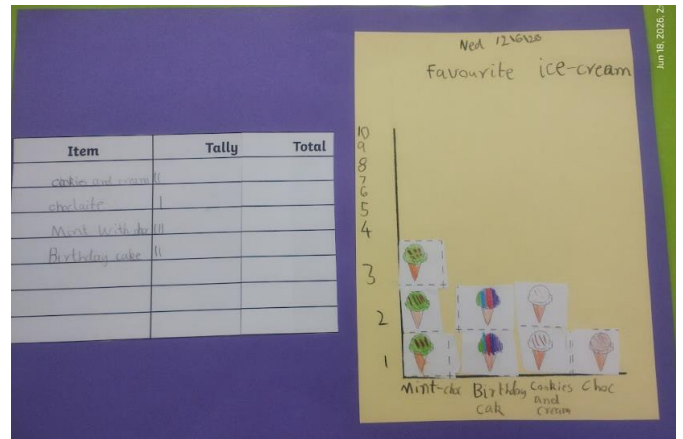

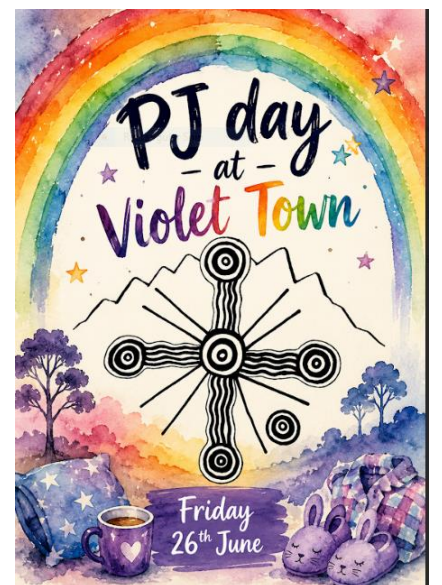
