What is PBS?

The goal of School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) at Peranbin Primary College is to create and maintain a positive and safe learning environment that enhances our school culture where we maximise individual academic and social growth.

PBS is "...a broad range of systematic and individualised strategies for achieving important social and learning outcomes while preventing problem behaviour with all students." (Sugai & Homer, 2001;2002)

The PBS approach is comprised of evidence based behavioural interventions and practices that can be implemented by staff to effectively address and support the socially and educationally important behaviour needs of students and their families.

PBS has conceptual foundations in:

- Behavioural Theory – Behaviour is learned, lawful and malleable.
- Applied Behaviour Analysis – Behavioural theory, principles and practices that are applied in the settings in which they are observed.
- Positive Behaviour Support – Behavioural supports are considered in the larger context of improving quality of life.

Through the implementation of PBS, school wide systems are aligned to create an inclusive environment where there is a:

1. Common purpose and approach to discipline
2. Clear set of positive expectations and behaviours
3. Procedures for teaching expected behaviour
4. Continuum of procedures for encouraging expected behaviour
5. Continuum of procedures for discouraging inappropriate behaviour
6. Procedures for data collection, ongoing monitoring and evaluation.



Our Values

At Peranbin Primary College, we want to feel happy, safe and ready to learn.

To help us feel this way at school, we have four values:

We RESPECT each other

We SUPPORT each other

When we learn about our school values, these are the areas that we will talk about:

Our teachers use our PBS Matrix to help teach us how we need to act and how we can help ourselves and others feel ready to learn and play. Our matrix shows us what is expected when we are in the different areas in our school. Our teachers help us to learn these skills so we know how to make positive choices and help everyone to be happy and safe at school.

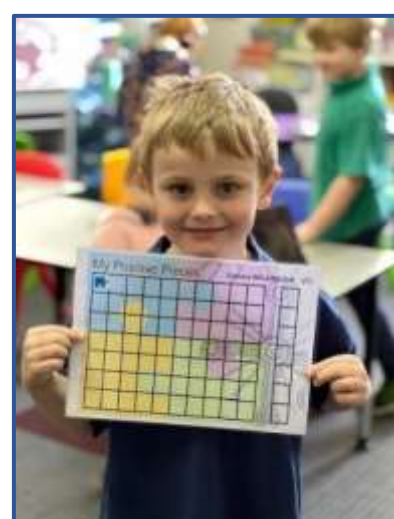

Peranbin Positive Pieces Acknowledgment

When we are showing our school values and making positive choices, our behaviour can be acknowledged with a sticker called a Peranbin Positive Piece or PPP. Everyone has a Positive Pieces chart in their classroom where we can collect our stickers. When we collect different amounts of PPP, we can trade them in. It is really exciting to trade in Peranbin Positive Pieces and every semester our school chooses different things we can achieve. Some of the things we can work towards include having lunch with a special friend, rent your teacher's chair, or having a special toy on your desk.

When we are ready to trade in our PPP, we tell our classroom teacher. They help us to organise our choice then get it signed off on our chart. Everyone who trades in their PPP receives a certificate and gets to stand up at assembly. It's exciting to share our achievements with the whole school.
